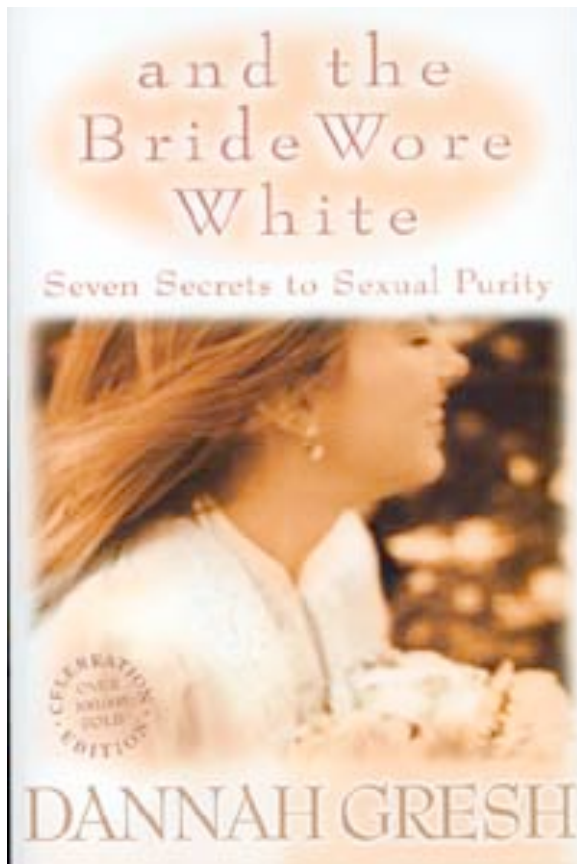

SUMMARY

Objective

You have read the book *AND THE BRIDE WORE WHITE* by Dannah Gresh. By now, you should have an understanding that God's intent is for all of His people to live in Purity. Goals

Invite a few friends and make it fun. Maybe you can help someone else to find the freedom you have found. Celebrate your new way of thinking about sex, dating, and your future husband.

Choices

As a culminating activity you should choose one of the following activities to complete. These tasks are meant to be shared. Not only will you showcase your knowledge, you will spark an interest or change a heart.

- Dream Guy Collage. Gather the following supplies: old magazines, poster board, scissors, glue, glitter, and other decorative items. Look through the magazines and cut out pictures, words, phrases, and letters to create words of characteristics, looks, hobbies, etc. that you want in your future husband. Share this with your friends and encourage their involvement. Hang them in a visible place (like your bedroom) to remind you of your goal.

OR

- Future Husband Scrapbook. Gather the following supplies: Scrapbook paper, paper for inside pages (could use the thin decorative paper), colorful ribbon, hole punch,

curvy scissors or other scrapbooking tools, glitter, and other decorative items. Cut and decorate pieces of scrapbook paper to be covers for your journal. Use decorative scrapbook paper and cut out letters, etc. for this. Be creative. With supervision, you could even burn the edges to give it an “antique look.” Take the thinner paper and cut out pages for your scrapbook. Punch holes in them and tie together with ribbon. Use the first page to make a list of the qualities you want in your future husband. Save another page or two after that in case your list gets longer or you make changes. Then, use the rest of the scrapbook to write prayers, thoughts, and Scripture verses about and over your future husband.

Whichever one you choose, have fun with it. Share with someone what you learned. Write a paragraph for the Girls Ministries website and include photos of your work. We would love to see the creative ideas you come up with. May your marriage-to-come be a portrait of your devotion for the Pearl of Great Price. He costs everything. He is worth the price.
